

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

MITCH JONES ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, OOZING FUTURE

Jean Genet once demanded of town planners that theatres should only be built in the shadow of cemeteries. This was how he proposed to emphasise the existential importance of the ritual space where we digest life and create meaning through image, action and story. The act of playing (both tragic and comic) is given substance by its relationship to our inevitable end. How suitable then, that Coburg cemetery lies just a little further down Bell Street from where you now sit...

Apocrypha takes Genet's fascination with the social outsider and turns it into a reclaimed mythology, filled with secular miracles. Those who are not given meaning by the central narratives of control, must create their own, and herein we propose to do just that. We are not satisfied by the sanitised caricatures of our communities, used to sell more memberships to the death cult of capitalism. So, this is an iconoclastic journey that focuses not on our heroism but on our flaws, treasuring

these as the proof that we are not

mass produced.

The elements that we use here are surprise and beauty, and our language is the universal tongue of visual poetry. In this dream state you are invited to recognise yourself, and create your own interpretations. But for me, this show is about how to live with kindness, hope and care for others, even while feeling that you don't fit in. In a selfish world, empathy is a radical act. Ultimately it is what keeps us out of the cemetery and amongst the living.

ALT-CIRCUS FOR THE UNHOLY

Apocrypha (a-) n. Hidden writings, works outside the accepted canon of scripture, social outsiders who do not fit the norm.

Enter the world of Apocrypha, the new ensemble show from circus provocateur Mitch Jones (AutoCannibal, Slava's Snowshow, Circus Oz) that journeys beyond the canon of mainstream culture.

See the tightrope walker dance along rusty chains, while the acrobat spins hula hoops which blacken his body with painted scars and contortionists balance precariously on weeping bluestone boulders.

Inspired by cult cinema, erotic fiction and the work of Jean Genet, this stunning new work of alt-circus explores the limits of our bodies, finding moments of beauty among the outcast and the unholy.

With a jaw-dropping cast including Adam Malone, Rindi Harradine, Kristian Santic, Kyall Shanks and Chloe Fazikas, Apocrypha is a deathdefying exploration of desire and counterculture that will linger long after the final curtain falls.


OOZING FUTURE

DAREBIN ARTS SPEAKEASY

Since 2018 Oozing Future has been developing new audiences for contemporary circus by centring theatricality, production design and diverse teams of artists within our practice. We call our combination of experimental apparatus and multidisciplinary practice 'Alt-Circus', and we use this label as a provocation to continue exploring how physical performance can create meaningful theatrical experiences. Our shows have toured around Australia and gained us an artistic reputation for making bold and insightful work that intrigues and entertains.

Darebin Arts Speakeasy is Darebin City Council's award-winning year-round independent performance and development program. For 10 years, the program has curated and invested in contemporary dance, circus, theatre and multi-disciplinary artists whose works offer audiences a dynamic and diverse mix of stories that matter to the community, celebrate cultural diversity and reflect the times we're living in.

Darebin Arts has backed many of the groundbreaking artists and companies that make Melbourne's art sector so iconic: RAWCUS, Ilbijerri Theatre Company, The Hayloft Project, Little Ones Theatre, Stephanie Lake Company, Elbow Room, MKA, Double Water Sign, and lead artists like Joel Bray, Michele Lee, Emilie Collyer, Anna Seymour, Stella Young and Sammy J.



ADAM MALONE

is an iconic, queer showstopper known for his remarkable talent and endless surprises. Beginning his professional career as a show pony at the age of 12, Adam has been captivating audiences across Australia and around the world with his diverse talents in acrobatics, traditional and contemporary circus, gymnastics, drag, burlesque, theatre, sideshow, and beauty.


Since graduating from the National Institute of Circus Arts (NICA) in 2018, Adam has performed with renowned companies such as Circus Oz, Pippin the Musical, Yummy, Circus Monoxide, Blunderland, and Bernie Dieter's Club Kabaret. In 2022, he was crowned MX Burlesque Victoria and has made a significant impact across Australia's queer, cabaret, burlesque, and club scenes.



RINDI HARRIDINE

has always been a performer. Whether it was busking outside the chicken shop as a child or performing shows with her cousins on the veranda. It wasn't until a tissu was hung in the back shed of her 1700-acre property in northern NSW that she turned her eye to circus. Hanging up her muddied workboots, Rindi left her little valley to further her skills at the National Institute of Circus Arts. Since graduating in 2022, Rindi has performed with Circus Oz, AfterDark Theatre and HeadFirst Acrobats both nationally and internationally.

is a physical performer, creative director and arts advocate with two decades of experience in creating thought-provoking and playful shows that experiment with genre and style.

As professional unusualist and daredevil Captain Ruin he has toured extensively, performing on the main circus stage of Glastonbury Festival, hanging in a straitjacket underneath a 26m high crane for Sydney Festival and appearing in the 2023 season of Americas Got Talent: Allstars.

Jones' company work includes training with La Fura Dels Baus director Younes Bachir, working as a core member of Snuff Puppets, performing the lead character in Circus Oz's *Model*

Citizens and playing Green Clown in Slava's Snowshow.

In 2018 he founded Oozing Future, a physical theatre company using experimental performance to create conversations about aesthetic and political ideas. *AutoCannibal* (2019) explored self-harm as a metaphor for climate change through dark clown, and toured to Sydney and Darwin festivals (2021/2022). It was described as 'the kind of work that gives Melbourne its reputation for considered, influential independent theatre' – Tim Byrne, **Time Out**.



DANS MAREE SHEEHAN

Dans has extensive experience in performing arts in Australia and internationally. Highlights include touring with Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre, being a company member of Elevator Repair Service Theater in New York, and working with both Back to Back Theatre and Circus Oz. Committed to compassion and authenticity, Dans fosters community and collaboration in her work producing for independent companies in a number of art forms, including Clubhouse Productions, Pony Cam Collective, Die Roten Punkte, Oozing Future, David Woods and Circus Oz. She is also the Creative Producer of Fish Creek Carnival in regional Victoria.
