CREATOR'S MESSAGE

JACKSON CASTIGLIONE CONCEPT, WRITER & DIRECTOR

One Night Only started as a napkin pitch with Kate Sulan (then Artistic Director of Rawcus) at a cafe in Northcote in 2018. Kate's enthusiasm helped to birth the journey of a project which ended up being close to impossible to realise but with the exceptional work of many people it is finally here, alive and in front of you tonight.

The idea came to me at a time in my life when I was reconciling with the responsibility I had as a first-time parent after nearly 10 years of trying to conceive then navigate Australia's deeply problematic adoption system. In lots of ways, how my partner and I finally became parents was also close to impossible, and when it finally arrived it was something I felt completely unprepared for. Whether I wanted it to be or not, becoming a parent was life changing. Feeling ill-equipped to take on this lifelong responsibility, I started to wonder: what moments in other people's lives had had these similar effects? What other moments, big and small, come to define us?

This project is also a collaboration with Rawcus, and without them, it would not have been possible. It's important to acknowledge the

contributions of Morgan Rose (Co-Writer and Rawcus's Co-Artistic Director), Josh, Paul and Rachel along with the other members of Rawcus who have contributed their stories and expertise to help develop this performance, Alison Halit has also made a wonderful contribution helping to bring the many parts of this show together. Samuel Kreusler and Kate Neal have added an exceptional immersive composition and sound design. Richard Vabre's lighting and sculptures have helped to clarify the worlds of the show and created beautiful abstract imagery. And Kaite Head and Kate Washington's production support has helped to shape the diverse needs of our team ad project. Finally Connor Brown's sound mixing provides the best possible sound.

One Night Only is an attempt to connect people — to connect our audience with many different stories. It's an attempt to recognise difference and diversity but also celebrate what it is we have in common. And to acknowledge and accept the joy, sadness and infinite possibilities of what it means to be human.

Each night an ordinary citizen takes on the role of the Protagonist, playing out the story of their life before our eyes. With the Rawcus team as their supporting cast, the Protagonist jumps backwards and forwards through time, reenacting the pivotal moments large and small that have shaped who they are.

Revisiting love, grief, heartbreak, joy, conflict, catharsis and serendipity with us as their witness, this bold production journeys into what make us unique, and what we all have in common. With a new Protagonist stepping onto the stage each night, *One Night Only* is an unrepeatable experiment that asks, what constitutes our shared humanity?

COLLABORATING COMPANY RAWCUS

Rawcus is an award-winning and critically acclaimed long-term ensemble of artists with diverse minds, bodies, and imaginations. The ensemble devises new work that expresses the imaginative world of its members. Drawing on dance, theatre and visual art disciplines, the work is crafted with a precision that supports the performers, and allows space for their inherent sense of anarchy. Rawcus' performance aesthetic is characterised by a marriage of intense physicality, arresting visual imagery and devised text.

Rawcus is known for adventurous, unexpected and highly successful collaborations. For 25 years, Rawcus' work has been featured as part of the Melbourne International Arts Festival, Dance Massive, Next Wave, and Melbourne Fringe, and has worked with artists and companies including the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, The Invenio Singers, Fast Fashun, and Restless Dance.

In addition to work in the theatre,
Rawcus has created photo exhibitions,
community gatherings, short films,
visual artworks, interactive public
performances, and projection art.
Rawcus has been nominated for and
won numerous awards including a
2019 Helpmann Award Nomination for
Best Production for Song for a Weary
Throat. Most recently the company
was awarded a Green Room Award for
Outstanding Production/Independent
Theatre for the new work Interior
(2024).

Jackson works both as an independent artist and as the Artistic Director of Infinity, a company making performances and experiences with and for young people and adult audiences. He was also a co-founding member of *Field Theory* (2009 to 2019) and has also been a core member of pvi collective (1999 to 2010). Jackson was born on Whadjuk Noongar Country Boorloo/Perth and lives and works on the sovereign lands of the Kulin Nation in Narrm/Melbourne.
